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Director's Review

Again what a privilege it is for me to introduce our latest magazine – 'Report'.

Kids4school started in response to a need - eight years on and what a difference together we have made to children and their families. Eight years on and we are still rising and responding to needs of different sorts.

The need initially was for children in Tanzania to get into school. This need will always be there as this vast country has so many children in rural areas that are missing out on the opportunity of education. Our Child Sponsorship Program now has over 1300 children. This means they get all they need to go to school - a uniform, shoes and stationary. Also, children cannot learn when they are hungry so they also get a meal every day - and the teachers say what a difference this makes on their ability to learn.

Other needs include our building program and needs are kept constantly under review, and hit head on at the many government run primary & secondary schools where we work. Maintenance work, new classrooms, toilets and perhaps most importantly water tanks are constantly being accessed and acted on.

One of our greatest needs is oversight - and the Lord has truly blessed kids4school in this area. John & Grace spent 10 weeks overseeing the construction work at our new Christian Academy in 2016 and plans are already made for 2017 for a similar period of time. Jackie has been granted her special visa for

2 years, which will enable her to oversee all of the administration, registration, food distribution and more. This visa is extremely hard to get so we praise the Lord for His faithfulness.

We have been blessed this year with Work & Witness Mission Teams and the way their contribution has met many of the needs of the ministry. We are excited at the prospects of many more of these special folks heading out to Tanzania in 2017.

It goes without saying of course that all that has been accomplished, and all the needs that are being met has only been possible by the faithfulness of our supporters – it is indeed a team effort. God is faithful, and works through His people and with the hymn writer we can only but say

'Great is Thy faithfulness!'
'Great is Thy faithfulness!'
Morning by morning new mercies I see;
All I have needed Thy hand hath provided
'Great is Thy faithfulness,' Lord, unto me!



AN UPDATE ON kids4school ACADEMY




ACADEMY CHURCH

- Our 18 acre site which our academy is being built on is taking shape. Building on the Administration block and Primary School has begun and they are sitting at sub floor level. There are 2 Vocational Training Centres built and painted. Skilled men from our July work & witness team were able to wire the VTC, leaving it complete with electrics and ready for training to begin shortly.
- Our Academy, when finished, will be the means to not only provide a good quality education to our children but also an outlet where we can have a significant impact on the children's lives spiritually. As it will be a Christian, English speaking School, there will be no language barrier to overcome and we will have free reign to spread the good news to every child and teacher at our School.
- Many Churches / supporters are contributing financially on a regular basis to the building of our Academy. We would like to give special thanks to Dungannon Presbyterian, Silverbirch Evangelical, 1st Donegore Presbyterian and Margaret Robinson... and others for their ongoing support with this project.

ACADEMY PLANS

JOHN & GRACE ADVENTURES IN TANZANIA!

You may remember that in last year's magazine we reported on our trip as short term missionaries to Tanzania and mentioned that we were off again on our adventures in May 2016. It seemed no time at all until we were departing once again for Dublin Airport on our way to Dar es Salaam and after the usual long coach journey we arrived safely in Dodoma with a ten week programme ahead of us.

I paid my first visit to the Academy site since last year and was pleased to see that walls had been completed on the first Vocational Training Centre and work was under way on installing roof trusses. I then got work underway immediately on roofing the VTC and commencing building to roof on the second VTC. Foundation work was also begun on the Admin Block and Primary School buildings. Despite many challenges with supplies of materials it was good to keep things moving. When a large team from NI arrived in early July we were able to make even more progress with wiring and painting of the newly roofed building being completed. Roof trusses were constructed on site, put into place on VTC2 and that as we left the roof sheets were about to be fitted leaving it ready for plastering.

An important part of the kids4school work is in the delivery of food to sponsored families and Grace worked hard with David Ntandu to get as much

as possible delivered before the schools closed for holidays. The usual procedure is to collect the pupils from their school

allowing them to guide us to their home for the delivery. If the schools are closed we have no way of getting in touch with the families so it was important to get things done before the school holidays. Following the break the k4s team were also able to see and assist first hand in this rewarding ministry.

There is so much more to do out there but it has been another tremendously rewarding experience to have been able to assist in bringing the vision of a Christian Academy to reality, literally from the ground up.

The adventure is not yet over, watch this space for the continuing story!


HMP MAGHABERRY PARTNERS WITH K4S Braille Books & Bible Stories

MY GOINGS ON ADVENTURES IN TANZANIA!

After returning from a work trip to Tanzania in August 2015, I was asked if I would consider taking up a short term post in Tanzania to oversee the administration of the work of Kids4school and look into the opening of the new school project. I love Africa, and feel very much at home in Tanzania, so after giving it some thought, I decided that this was exactly what I wanted to do. Although it started as a 6 month assignment, it quickly grew to 2.5 years, and on 25th February 2016 I left Dublin airport for my first trip which was to last 3 months.

Visitors to Tanzania are only permitted to stay in the Country up to 90 days on a visitor's visa, so my first task (apart from starting to learn the language) was to apply for a work permit. This has become a very tedious and difficult task, but thankfully it was finally granted in August for a period of 2 years. I am now awaiting the approval of my residence permit so that next year I can stay and work in the Country for much longer periods.

Over the last 6 months, we have re-registered all the children on the program (over 1000 existing sponsored children across 9 primary schools and 5 secondary schools), providing them with new uniforms and shoes. We have been able to register over 300 new children onto the sponsorship program, maintain a regular food supply to families (despite challenges with flooding, mechanical problems, health issues, and every day obstacles that can't be avoided), and identify and place appropriate children into our sewing vocational course.

We have forged relationships with some local shop keepers in Dodoma in order to secure reduced prices for certain uniform items, shoes, sewing materials, etc, when ordering large quantities. We have spent time with the ladies who sew uniform items for us at our Vocational Training Centre, and after a very frustrating start, they now have a good system in place whereby they are producing well finished items in a timely fashion.

We also identified 2 special needs schools that

very much need assistance. All the children (who all board at school) have been registered onto the sponsorship program and we have been able to spoil them a little as well as purchase and distribute some much needed supplies such as blankets, pillows, mattresses, mosquito nets, beds, frames for mosquito nets, etc.

We have visited several Government and Church run schools to get advice on the opening of our new school, which is currently under construction. In 2017 we will start the proposals to get our school registered, and make appointments for interviews with the Education Ward Co-ordinators and Boards.

It has been my absolute pleasure to be able to present the children with gifts and letters from sponsors and see their joy and excitement, and I consider it a privilege to have been able to spend the last 6 months living and working among the people of Tanzania. I have enjoyed getting to know their customs, traditions and way of life; the children are an utter delight, and I am really looking forward to returning in January as there is so much work to be done (plus, I'm missing the sunshine)!

We would appreciate your thoughts and prayers. Asante sana na Mungu awabariki (Thank you and God bless).





Letters Keeping in touch

Every year, the children on our sponsorship program sit down and write a letter to their sponsor. This is a very exciting time for the children as many have already received written letters from their sponsors and know who helps them to go to School, so this is a chance for them to write a letter back.

Children will find a shady spot, under a tree or in the shadow of a building and take much time pondering over what they will say. Many are unsure of just what to say as this might be the first letter ever written by them. There are some that have difficulty in forming sentences or expressing themselves and so only write a little, but you can be sure that there is much happiness that comes with the opportunity of going to School and for this, they are very grateful.

If you have not written to your sponsor child yet, please consider doing this. It doesn't have to be an essay, just a few words to let them know that you love them and to work hard and continue on in School. The children love to hear from you and something as simple as a small letter will bring a lot of happiness to our children.



Reports

Coming up to the end of a School year, the teachers complete a report card for each child on our program. This report is then forwarded on to the sponsor of each child to let them know how he/she is getting on in School. It is great to get this feedback and see how the children are progressing.

One of our supporter received the report card for her little girl and wrote:

LABOUR IN FAITH & TRUST

The LIFT team travelled with the Kids4school team, which meant we could all share the bus from Dar es Salaam to Dodoma and return. Although the two teams had clearly defined and different reasons for being there they did share in fellowship times and worked together on a number of other jobs.

The LIFT teams main project was to carry out work at the Kids4school purpose built site which was about 20 minute walk from their mission compound. The school when completed will have a Primary School, Secondary School and Vocational School as well as an Administration block, toilets and sports ground. The team managed to erect the fascia and barge boards as well as some 'Blanding' work which is a timber grid work for the plasterboard ceilings to be fixed to as well as trimming out and making timber access hatches on the vocational school building.

They also worked at adopting and bolting together many children's school desks which had been previously sent out in a container from Northern Ireland.

While in Tanzania on a Sunday afternoon we visited Buigiri Blind School, there were 83 children at the school some were totally blind and others were partly sighted. There were also many Albino children at the school. The conditions in the school were very basic and poor, with appalling kitchen, toilet and shower facilities, holes in the roofs, glass broken in the windows, a dangerous playground area, uneven terrain outside, many steps and the children had very little of anything. Kids4school have since managed to sign up all the children and in time this should bring better conditions and standard of living for these children.

So we decided that a LIFT team next year could make a big difference to the lives of these children and bring some basic comforts and improve the general

safety of the site. So we hope to take a team of Joiners, Plumbers, Electricians, Glazers, Tilers, a digger driver and Handy Enthusiasts to the school working in partnership with Kids4school from 1st to 15th July 2017. HOMBOLO SPECIAL

New comforts for all

Hombolo Special is a small government run School for children who are physically impaired, blind, partially sighted or affected by Albinism. Kids4school identified this school back in March 2016 after a visit to Hombolo Primary School. After seeing children being taught separately to main stream pupils and children who didn't seem to be getting the support that they required, kids4school stepped in and offered practical & financial assistance in order to enrich the lives of these precious children.

When we inspected the living quarters of the kids, it was quite clear that help was needed.

- Children had to share beds as there were not enough to go round.
- Mattresses were old, stained and urine soaked due to the medical conditions of some of the children. Some mattresses were even riddled with insects.
- There were not enough mosquito nets to cover every bed and the nets that were in place had extremely large holes in them.
- The children had no outdoor playground equipment or activities, no toys or games to help stimulate their minds.
- There was no electricity and so when darkness came, children went straight to bed.
- There were no water facilities at the dorms. Water had to be collected twice daily from a water tap quite a distance away.
- Food was prepared outside and eaten outside. There were no tables or chairs - Actually there was no furniture at all.
- Some beds had no pillow, some had no blanket.

It became quite clear that although these children were being cared for as best as



possible, there was so much more that needed done – So that is what we did & within a couple of days, new blankets, pillows and mosquito nets had been ordered, bought and delivered to the School.

While the work & witness team were visiting the school in July, many fell in love with this lovely school and the extra special children that were at it. To the point where donations were received to purchase new mattresses, Bunk beds, mattress covers and many other comforts for the children... We would not embarrass anyone, but you know who you are and we are so grateful for this extra support.

BUIGIRI SPECIAL

School for the blind

Buigiri is a School for blind, partially sighted and children affected by albinism. This larger School came to our attention following our visit to Hombolo Special School. It was quite clear that although the facilities were slightly better than Hombolo, it still required similar support.

Bunk beds only had 1 mosquito net between them, no pillows or blankets, mattresses were thin and worn. The appearance of the building, inside and out, was in a bad state of repair – Simple things like broken toilet fittings and pipes, no connectors for water tanks, very high steps for blind children to climb – simple things that could be fixed with a bit of expertise and finance.

We registered 84 children onto our sponsorship program from Buigiri. These children needed our help and so were taken under the wing of kids4school. They can now be sure of an education, uniform, School supplies and ongoing practical support from kids4school.

Having an impairment in Tanzania means that



children are being pushed to the side, sent away from their families and in some cases, their lives put in danger, all because they are different. All these kids need is that little extra helping hand to provide things to make their lives that little bit easier. With extra love and support, these special gifts from God can go on to lead healthy and normal lives.

The gift of shoes will enable a child to walk to School every day with ease.




SCHOOL BAG
